## Outdoor Report The week of August 3, 2020

- **Firearms Antelope applications are due August 14 with paper application and August 19 by 8am online.**
- **The Youth Sportsfests in the area have been cancelled this year due to Covid-19.**

### **Aberdeen Area Fishing Report**

**Richmond:** Anglers have been catching walleye, bluegill, crappie, and perch. Fishermen are catching panfish bobber fishing with worms from the docks. Great opportunity to take a kid fishing.

**Elm:** The high water is still going down, so please be courteous on the lake. Anglers have been catching walleye and northern pike. Anglers that have been pulling plugs and spinners with worms are having the best luck.

**Wylie:** The Game, Fish and Parks has recently stocked bluegill, smallmouth bass, and white bass into the lake. This is a great area to take kids fishing.

**Elm River:** Fishing has been slow due to the high water.

**James River:** Anglers are catching northern pike. The walleye bite has been slow. Bow fishermen are having good luck shooting carp. **Anglers shooting carp need to pick up shot fish and dispose of them properly.**

**Mina:** Anglers have been catching walleye, northern pike, catfish, perch, and bluegill. The walleye bite has been better in the evenings.

### **Clark County Fishing Report**

This weekend proved that some fish can still be caught on the right lake at the right time. Some fish finally removed the masks and showed up at **Dry 2, Indian, Swan and Reid Lakes**. It seems to vary day to day speaking with the anglers. Appears that early mornings have been the best times to get out and catch the bite, tremendously slowing off during the evening hours.

Remember hunting seasons are coming up a month away. Make sure to get all the proper license before your season of choice starts up.

### **Codington County Fishing Report**

**Goose:** Weed growth has made shore fishing difficult. Boat fishermen are catching walleye, most of which have been under 15 inches.

**Kampeska:** Anglers are still catching a mixed bag of fish from shore and by boat, including (northern pike, white bass, perch, crappie and walleye.)

**Pelican Lake:** Little fishing activity. Anglers are targeting the weed lines and open patches in the weeds.

**Blythe Slough:** Closed to boating from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 to August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

### **Day County Fishing Report**

**Due to the high water and safety hazard of a potential vehicle and pedestrian accident, the county is no longer allowing pedestrians on the Grenville grade, Day Co 1 north of Hwy 12 to 140<sup>th</sup> St., and Yellowstone trail from Main St. to Day Co 1. Also, if you are shore fishing make sure you are parked in a legal parking spot and it is not posted as no parking.**

**North Rush:** Fishing pressure has been low, along with success.

**South Rush:** Continuing to see high fishing pressure with marginal success for walleye, some anglers catching a few crappies.

**Waubay:** Some anglers have been having some luck catching walleye with the occasional perch and smallmouth bass.

**Bitter:** Still seeing some good fishing pressure with anglers catching walleye and perch.

### Fishing Report

**Opitz:** Good walleye fishing in the morning and evenings near timbered main lake points. This would be a great lake to take a kid fishing.

**Roy:** Good bass and decent walleye bite near main lake structure.

**Clear:** Great bass bite near main lake points and near shore edges. Good panfish bite near sunken islands.

**Buffalo lakes:** The panfish bite has been sporadic at best. The anglers moving around to find the best bite are doing really well.
